 Function It acts as a single noun, even though it refers to multiple members. Example Sentence A flock of birds flew across the sky. (Flock is the collective noun for the group of birds.) This is a great question! For Class 4, it's easiest to remember this simple rule: Most of the time, we treat a collective noun as one single group, so we use a singular
verb with it. The team is playing well. (The whole team is playing as one unit.) The class is going on a field trip. (The whole team is playing as one.) Simple Tip: Think of the word "group." You would say, "The group is happy," not "The group are happy." Use the same logic for
other collective nouns! A collective noun is a naming word for a group. It can name a group of people (army, class), animals (flock, pride), or things (bunch, fleet).
