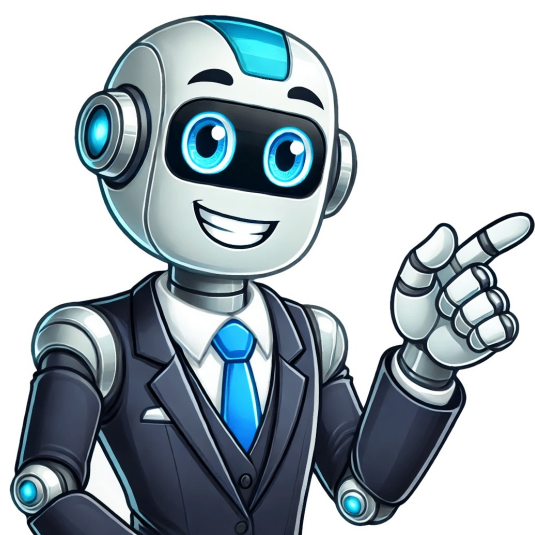

Please click the relevant link below to purchase this book via Amazon: If you're based in Europe but outside the UK, then this book is also available on the version of Amazon in your country.Number Criss Cross Solving Tips If you are new to these puzzles, then being presented with a blank grid and a list of numbers and being expected to solve the puzzle can be a bit daunting, but actually these a fun challenge with very simple solving methods available!At the start of the puzzle, the usual way to make progress is to look at the length of each of the numbers: for instance 3 digit numbers, 4 digit numbers and so forth - and then to look at the ones with the least options. For instance if there are 2 9-digit numbers but at least 4 of each other length of number, then you should start with the 9-digit numbers, and see if any can be placed.The best thing to do is to say: "If we place this 9-digit number here, then will it stop any other crossing number from being placed?". If the answer is YES, then you know that this number doesn't go here. Where there are only two options, you can now place both straightaway: place this number that you just said YES to at the OTHER 9-digit location, and place the second of the 9-digit numbers at this location. If there are more than two options available, then discount this one and work down the list, noting for each one if it can be placed or not.In instances where there is only one that can be placed here, then place it. Sometimes you will whittle down the options to something manageable like two. Here you have two options: you can look elsewhere in the grid and repeat the process, or if you fancy a tougher challenge you can try to mentally keep track of both options and see how quickly you come to a contradiction.Sometimes you will note that each option has the same number at a crossover, no matter which option you pick: for instance if both 9-letter digits have a '3' as the fifth digit, then that can be written in. Now if that is a crossover digit in the grid, then this can often be used to place other numbers elsewhere, or at least reduce the options: so sometimes you don't even need to know which number to place to make progress!Every puzzle here has one solution, and you can use logical rules to find it, you don't need blind guessing, just some 'if this then that then... that's a contradiction' sort of logic, good luck! Solve these word puzzles as a way todeveloplogical thinking and pattern matching skills needed to enjoy both computing and maths, while practicing reading, writing and spelling. (see also our maths kriss-kross). Kriss-kross puzzles combine a love of words with a love of logic. Given a list of words of different lengths, you must fit them all in to the grid. Learn about: computational thinking logicalthinking pattern matching Also for younger children practice and explore: numeracy counting writing letters phonics spelling Teach as part of: computing maths english, or linked to a theme Starting Strategies If there is only one word of any length left then find the blank word in the grid of that length and the word goes there. If you know some letters of a word in the grid then count how many letters long it is and compare the unused words of that length with the pattern of known letters. If only one matches you have found where it goes. Otherwise you need more information so try another word in the grid. Below are Kriss-Krosspuzzle sheets and solutions that you can download. Kriss-kross are a fun way to practice phonics at the same time as counting and starting logical thinking with children just learning to read. For the younger age group, talk them through the steps of what to look for which word to start with (one where there is nothing more of that length, then point them to a word you know a letter of and so on). Have them read the word before and after filling it in. History: Egypt and the Egyptians Our Egypt and the Egyptians kriss cross puzzle should certainly challenge everyones spelling. Start with the 4 letter, 8 letter, 11 letter and 13 letter words as each has only one space it can go. Then work out which other words can cross over, sharing a letter. These two puzzles can also help your class familiarise themselves with programming and technology-related vocabulary and spellings. Do the puzzles and also find out what all the words mean. Programming Words Technology WordsThis one is suitable for beginners, with lots of very familiar words relating to little animals and one or two to stretch the imagination (weevil nematode). Which, if any, of the words does not describe all birds, mammals etc? Which words when combined give a property of the animals (eg cold and blood -> warm-blooded)? Is it a bird? Is it an amphibian?This is a holiday / beach-themed kriss cross puzzle with words like deckchair, icecream and armbands. But also an 11 letter phrase Float To Live (written with no spaces) that reminds people how to stay safe when out on the water. There is also information on what to look out for to keep others safe. CS4FN at the beach.These are a little different in that youre not entering letters into the grid, but simple maths equations. So 5+2= is a 5 symbol word and 25=20+ is a 7 symbol word. Kriss Kross (aka Criss Cross, Jig Word, Fill In, Fill-It-In and Word Fit) is one of the most popular of all puzzle types. We give the solver a list of words to fit into a grid of interlocking squares resembling an asymmetrical crossword. There is only one possible way in which all the words will piece together. Where it appears that more than one word can fit in a particular word space, the solver will have to think a few steps ahead to determine which word belongs there.We can compile themed word lists to use for kriss kross. This makes the puzzle popular for childrens publications as not only are they fun to solve, but they also help with spelling and vocabulary. A starter word can be placed in the grid to give the solver a helping hand. For an extra element of fun, or to use the puzzle for a competition, there may be one word in the list that does not belong in the grid and its the solvers task to identify it. Alternatively, the letters in highlighted squares in the completed grid can spell out a word or an anagram.To help solvers identify the word spaces in the grid where a word of a particular length can go, we can include small numbers in the printed grids to indicate the word length required to fill each space. When playing our digital kriss kross, a solver can click on the word in the list and all spaces in the grid of the right word length will light up or the solver can click on a word space in the grid to light up all words in the list of the right length. For the solver, this is a real time-saver.The kriss kross is closely related to the Fit Word. A version of the puzzle using numbers instead of words is Number Jig / Number Fit. Use basic math skills to solve a crossword-type puzzleThe cross-number puzzle replaces the words in a crossword with numeric digits, and math equations replace the word hints. The larger the puzzle you select, the larger the maximum size of the numbers that go into the grid, as well as the more difficult the math problems. You can select the kind of math problems to use, so this puzzle can be made to be solvable by students who are only proficient with their multi-digit addition skills. Where would you start and why?...There is only one three digit number with a 3 in the tens column, so 438 is a good choice for the first column.When done well, the journal entries should provide an extensive record of student thought processes. One solution is... ...Are there others? Extensions When you have a solution, number your puzzle boxes in the same way as a crossword is numbered. Create equations ('sums') which have the puzzle answers as their answers. Try your equations out on another student. Create your own Criss-Cross Number puzzle. Is it possible to create one with no clues printed on the puzzle, and have a unique solution? Create your own Criss-Cross Number puzzle where the clues are equations. If you haven't noticed already, take a second look at the black squares. If you still don't notice anything, focus attention on just one set of the black squares and rotate the board 90 degrees. The set you are watching moves on, but another set moves in to take its exact place. The task was created by starting with a board that is rotationally symmetric; in this case rotation symmetry of order 4 (why?). Is the board you created above rotationally symmetric? If not, create another puzzle which begins with one of these boards. Calculating Changes Members can extend the equation making in a cross number and crossword context using a calculator and the activity The Good Oil.
