In response to the pandemic, North Carolina's Department of Motor Vehicles temporarily waived the road tests for specific drivers. For instance, 18 years old and older who needed a Class C license were allowed to apply for the waivers. On the other hand, those 17 and 16 years old were allowed to apply for a Level 2 limited license. The NCDOT noted that the pandemic had only temporarily affected the procedures of the Department of Motor Vehicles. One of the changes was the reduction in the time that teen drivers had to hold a Level 1 license before they could apply for a Level 1 license was reduced to six months from 12 months.
