Leonard Cohen recalled the idea came from learning about the tragedy that occurred in the death camps, where people would be forced to stand beside the crematoria. A string quartet performed at a time when horror reigned, their fate inextricably linked to the brutality unfolding around them. As they played classical music, fellow prisoners met their demise and were burned. The song "Dance Me to Your Beauty" took on a life of its own, with lyrics that spoke of surrendering to love as the ultimate consummation of life. The track, part of Leonard Cohen's Various Positions album, was produced by John Lissauer and first released in 1974. Lissauer recalled being tasked with creating an album that would make Cohen international, which ultimately resulted in two standout tracks: "Dance Me" and "Hallelujah." The song's origins began as a simple demo, with Cohen playing a cheap Casio synthesizer to create the beat. The recording process involved Cohen manipulating a single key on his toy instrument to produce the drumbeat. This approach was intentionally simplistic, allowing talented musicians to shine without overplaying. The final result was a seductive and languid rendition of "Dance Me," which featured Jennifer Warnes' personal vocals alongside Cohen's. Over the years, "Dance Me to Your Beauty" has been covered by various artists, including Madeleine Peyroux and The Civil Wars.
