

To pass the road rules theory test, you need to sit a computerized theory test at a Driver and Vehicle Services (DVS) centre or agent after applying for your learner's permit. You'll need to pay a fee and ensure that all tests start before 3:45 pm. If you don't pass, you'll need to resit the test on another day and pay a resit fee. To get your WA learner's permit, you must pass the Learner's Theory Test, which can be prepared with practice tests offered on this website. You need to be at least 16 years old, provide identification, and pass a vision test. Additionally, you must be medically fit to drive and pay the required fees for the permit and test. Even though learner's permit holders are allowed to drive, there are specific rules they must follow. Ignoring these rules may result in fines or loss of your permit. Some key restrictions include: * No alcohol is permitted in your system (BAC = 0) * Demerit points: 4 points for a Type 1 Novice * Display L plates on the front and back of your vehicle * Maximum speed limit indicated on signs, up to 100 km/h * A supervising driver must accompany you at all times while driving * Mobile phones can only be used for making or receiving calls if securely mounted or voice-activated These restrictions apply to Class C vehicles (cars) and do not extend to buses, trucks, or motorcycles. To pass the official DOL written exam, one must achieve at least 80% in the test consisting of 40 multiple-choice questions covering traffic laws, road signs, safe driving practices, and more as outlined in the Washington Driver's manual. Obtaining a learner's permit requires passing the vision screening and written knowledge test. This test can be taken in person at the DOL, but if failed, it must be retaken after paying a retest fee. Washington's Graduated Driver's License program introduces driving privileges to teens under 18 through a three-stage process: learner's permit, intermediate license, and full license. To apply for a permit at the age of 15 1/2 or with a driver training course at 15, one must pass the written test and vision screening. Accompanied by a licensed adult over 21 years old, drivers cannot use mobile devices during this phase. After holding the learner's permit for six months and graduating from a driver education program, teens can take the road test to advance to the intermediate license. Finally, at 18, with all requirements met, one can become fully licensed. When applying for the knowledge test, present required documents like proof of identity, residency, and Social Security number. "Inattentional blindness" occurs when someone fails to notice something in their environment due to distraction or lack of attention. The solid white line between lanes means stay in your lane unless overtaking. If parked next to a curb, point your front wheels downhill to ensure safe turning. Lanes marked as "Transit" are reserved for public transportation vehicles only. The sign indicates you cannot complete the entire process of obtaining a learner's permit online; in-person visits are required. To get a learner's permit, provide proof of identity, residency, and payment. If under 18, add parental consent. In Washington State, driver's licenses can be obtained without prior learner's permits for those 18 or older after passing the knowledge test, vision screening, and driving test. There is no limit on permit test attempts; however, a fee applies after two failed attempts. The written test covers traffic laws, road signs, and safe driving practices.
