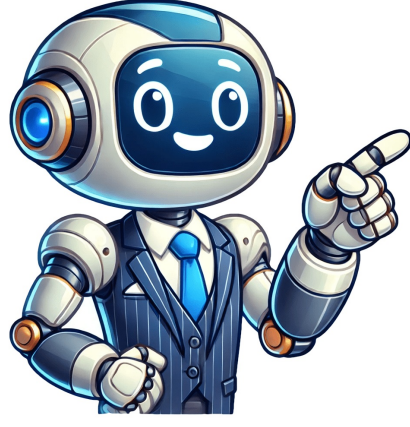

His team, Team B-Rad Racing, released a statement explaining that they will miss both the current and upcoming races, with hopes to make it to Bandimere. The team's car, LumiNasty, is reportedly "flying" right now, making their absence a disappointment for Eglian and his son. According to the points standings, B-Rad is currently tied for 19th place with several other drivers, used to race his Camaro often, but switched to his Lumina, nicknamed Luminasty, after two successful episodes of Street Outlaws. This led to an invitation to Bristol and eventually joined Street Outlaws- No Prep Kings, where he had an absolute blast. Brad prefers track racing over street racing due to the level of involvement fans can have at tracks like Galot Motorsports in Dunn, North Carolina. He's currently top 10 in points and aims to climb higher. His Lumina is equipped with a 632 cubic inch BES nitrous engine, which stands out from typical 900-plus cubic inch engines. Brad prioritizes updating his car over bragging about its performance. Recent updates include an Outlaw Powerglide transmission, double frame rail chassis, and reinforced chassis areas to handle the increased power. He strives for a strong and safe vehicle. Growing up around racing, Brad admired Pro Stock drivers like Bob Glidden and Warren Johnson. Now, he looks up to successful yet humble drivers like Mike Murillo. Brad is proud of his fan base, which makes all the hard work worth it, despite sometimes losing money at races. He even hands out Hot Wheels cars to kids and lets them sit in the car, hoping to inspire future drag racers. Brad, a drag racer with down-to-earth roots, is not just a driver but also a devoted husband and father of two. His children, aged 10 and 13, participate in junior dragster racing, and Brad proudly serves as both their dad and pit crew chief. He's deeply appreciative of the hard work his team puts in daily to support him. Brad's wife is an integral part of this racing family and has even been taken to the track on her birthday, a sign that he knew she was a perfect match for him. Together, they make an excellent team, not only in their personal lives but also in Brad's and his children's racing endeavors. For this year, Brad aims to focus on supporting everyone involved. "There will be a learning curve, but we'll figure it out," he confidently states. His philosophy of "doing more with less" resonates deeply with everyday people striving to make a living. In both his TV persona and real-life personality, Brad remains the same humble individual, allowing his car to do most of the talking. He's not someone who changes when cameras are rolling; instead, he stays true to himself.
