The book also explains Scarne's (Mercury) card fold technique, which features delightful line drawings of hands executing sleights by Donna Allen. While it includes numerous tricks from Vernon and Miller, some readers may be put off by the slightly formal writing style typical of the 1940s era. Additionally, the suggested patter might feel a bit dated for modern audiences in the 2020s. The only potential drawback I can see is that the book predates more advanced false counts like Elmsley's, which are now common practice. Despite these limitations, this foundational yet slightly challenging book remains an important resource for anyone serious about card magic.
